## Warehouse News

These last 3 months have been busy preparing for upcoming shipments! We have mainly been working on 2 shipments: a container to Tanzania, Africa for Bro. Livingstone Lambert and a crate to Japan for Bro. Teruha Tokuchi.

In April, we received a load of 40 pews<sup>1</sup> that we plan to ship to Bro. Livingstone. Those pews were disassembled in May with the help of the AR Mission Builders.<sup>2</sup> We then received 2 more truckloads of about 50 pews total to be included in this shipment that have yet to be disassembled at the time of this writing. We hope to do that very soon. Also included in this shipment will be other church furniture, books, and clothing. With all of these pews, we will most likely ship 2 containers at the same time to Tanzania, and we hope to ship this year. Regarding our last shipment to Tanzania, that crate is currently being held in Dubai due to the conflict with Iran and the Strait of Hormuz, and the current ETA for Tanzania is August 16th. The conflict is not affecting our ability to schedule further shipments to Africa, but it is affecting price and transit time. Please be in prayer for these shipments and the war as a whole. We trust in God's plan and timing!



We also are shipping a crate of personal items to Japan for Bro. Teruha, a Japanese man who earned a degree from TBI in Henderson, TX and is returning to Japan to work with his father's church. My dad and I met Teruha at LMBIS at Minden, LA to get the cargo, and my grandfather and I built the crate. We have experienced many delays as it was hard to find a customs agent in Japan willing to handle this shipment, but we hope to ship this soon. Please be in prayer for this shipment as well.



In June, we had a great time at the 100th ABA Messenger Meeting in Hot Springs, AR.<sup>3</sup> We had many productive and informative conversations with missionaries and pastors that may very well develop into future projects.

We also were able to have our gutters and automatic garage door on our warehouse repaired for \$4,760, which was very much needed. Thanks to our generous supporters, that expense was easily covered. Thank the Lord! (More pictures on back.)
